

Farmington Food Pantry month! St. James annually commits the month of June to focus on donations to the Farmington Food Pantry. The Pantry currently serves 40–50 families each week plus 20–30 individual clients. This is a 19% increase in clients since last Spring and summer can bring increased usage as well with the children out of school and needing "3 squares" at home. In addition to canned fruit, healthy snacks, Chef Boyardee, the Pantry needs to re-stock personal care items (toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, soap, shampoo and conditioner). Throughout the month of June, please place your donations in the grey bin marked Farmington Food Pantry located in the narthex (entrance lobby). Monetary donations are also accepted; simply make out your check to *St. James Parish* and include *Food Pantry* on the Note line. The St. James Outreach Ministry thanks you for your generous and continued support of the Pantry.
