In the Gospel of Matthew 25:35 Jesus says to the disciples:

" for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink. I was a stranger and you welcomed me in." The disciple's response: Lord when did we see you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink. In verse 40 Jesus replied; Truly I tell you just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me."

Many university and college students across the U.S. report lacking access to a reliable supply of nutritious food, a concept known as food insecurity, which can affect their ability to learn, according to research presented at the annual convention of the American Psychological Association.

After a successful collection of food for Capital Community College (CCC) Food Pantry using a Reverse Advent Calendar, Christ Church Cathedral is inviting you to join in a Lenten Discipline of loving and caring for our neighbors.

Let us support our college students. The statistics are concerning. 41% of undergraduates and 48% of community college students suffer from food insecurity. Many of the students are beneficiaries of SNAP Vouchers (formerly called Food Stamps), which does not allow for the purchase of personal hygiene products.

Therefore, we invite your community and its members to weekly collect one personal care hygiene product for each week of Lent to benefit Capital Community College (CCC) Food Pantry. Please note, and share with your community, the Director of CCC Food Pantry has identified the most needed hygiene products:

- Soap
- Shampoo
- Deodorant
- Conditioner
- Men's and Women's Razors Feminine hygiene products
- Large size Poise and Depends products.
- These items can be delivered to our Cathedral from Wednesday, April 7th to Friday, April 9th from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m or Sunday April 11 from 12:00pm to 2:00pm. Imagine what we as the North Central Region of ECCT can collectively accomplish for the students.

February 2021
The newly elected vestry had their 2021 retreat February 13 th . It is time to brainstorm! Significant changes are not far away. Hopefully, the pandemic will be brought under control in the months ahead as vaccinations reach the wider population. How will we return to more in-person activities? St. Mark's has been able to continue financially with the proceeds from its rectory sale. How will we supplement that revenue? Father Shaw will retire March 1, 2022. We need to plan now for a new priest in charge. What might God have in mind for St. Mark's and us as individuals? What would Jesus want us to do?
In the news:
 1. Our asking price for our 147 West Main St. property has been lowered to \$599K.
 2. Our Community Ministries committee has recommended several Smith Fund donations to benefit the New Britain community. (Vestry voted to ap- prove.)
 a. \$5K grant to Literacy Volunteers b. \$500 to the newly opened warming center at 57 Arch St. which is staffed by the Friendship Center and provides access to programs to help the homeless.
 c. \$400 to New Life II Ministries to support their recovery house. d. \$500 for coats for New Britain school children.
 3. Our CT diocese has mandated that clergy will lead Sunday worship services 3 out of 4 Sundays a month. This means that certified worship leaders will act in Father Shaw's place one Sunday a month. Barbara Campbell and Stephen Hard have accepted this ministry. Thank you! If anyone else feels called to do the same, please let Father Shaw know. At present, we are finding out details about worship leader training and certification.
God Bless you in this season of Lent. We are traveling the path of Jesus to do God's mission and be embraced in God's infinite love on Easter Day.


Pledges and Offerings
