What's New? By Barbara A. Campbell, Ph.D. Treasurer

Well, Lots! I know my parents, both bankers, were laughing their heads off at me once again putting on a mask and entering a bank - to transfer the 147 sale money to D&B. Now there even have to be new ways of doing what used to be done illegally by masked people!

But to get to be more churchy about this, we Zoomed into a Listening session on "Transition is the New Normal". That the title of a booklet guiding, in my dated vocabulary, "Personnel Policies" for the Episcopal Church in Connecticut. It is significant that it is "central office" raising the question of "How is it going with the "Transition""?

We were asked our greatest challenge and one parish said this summer the ground flour of their church and all the rooms down there were flooded.

Another parish said their building is very big and old and they had arranged for an outside agency to manage the building.

Another older women said she was retired and the only "non-working" person in the parish, therefore most of transition within the parish fell to her.

Location, location was an opportunity as at least one parish had more than half of the congregation under 40 and most were college students - church is walking distance for many Yalies.

This Zoom session was for clergy serving less than 1/2 time and parishioners - a session of listening to learn, to lead to action. Next steps were welcome. There were 38 people present, not all clergy.

One parish had had a Supply Priest, not a Priest in Charge, for more than a year (possible when a PIC position is open and posted.) Supply Priest are arranged sor Sunday by Sunday. On the most recent list, which is constantly changing, there are 23 names. Most of them have put travel limitations on the jobs they will travel to foro 58 and a half cents per mile. I especially liked "will Supply Litchfield County 6/1 - 9/1". Most do not retire to the Hartford area.

A parish that had a 1/4 PIC who retired said they were looking for a new PIC - maybe.

A church that I watched being build has had a 1/4 PIC for 9 years. And that raises a real issue as 1/4 PICs are usually also holding down secular jobs. In accordance with "Transition" policies, a part-time PIC is not allowed to be paid for funerals. To officiate at the funeral meant taking time off from the secular job. "Transition" policies on that are now being looked at.

Also raised were the new roles that are being filled by lay people, in particular Worship Leader and Preacher. Some parishes are very used to this, having done so for a number of years and resources will continue to be offered to laity new to preaching.

As the church and our culture both continue to change primarily due to Covid, different connections between and among people are being made, new policies will develop, even a process for filing a grievance - which to me sounds more like the school district! There will be another meeting, between April and June as we live further into these new worlds.

Election of the new Bishop Diocesan is on May 21, 20

An e-mail will be sent out to the parish every Friday to let you know if the service will be in-person or on **Zoom only.**

Then, enter the meeting number, and as part of the meeting number, please add the "pound" sign (#) at the end of the meeting number (as the verbal instructions direct).

The Zoom broadcast opens at 9:45 am when remote participants can be admitted and will be greeted by the e-verger.

Remote participants are encouraged to stay connected after the service and greet and be greeted during the coffee hour.
