Robert Fertitta provided the music thanks to an old friend, Mary-Rose DiGiovanna, our former Organist/Choir Director.

Finding an organist was about a month long project. Albert Tomasso, an outstanding organist, who performed on piano with his sister Lucy singing at our Christmas Eve ZOOM service, was my first attempt. After a week and a half of not receiving a return call to my multiple efforts to contact him, I decided to contact our retired organist Ben Gryk. However, on a Saturday evening when I e-mailed both parties, Robert Fertitta responded almost immediately. It turns out that he was Mary-Rose's professor at SUNY-Purchase. Long story, short, things worked out well. He has also photographed church windows, including St. Mark's and other ECCT churches, throughout the State and the disc will be available at the office.

Broadcast Instructions

Our service will always be available on Zoom with Meeting ID 500-865-037. You can enter via the parish Web link at http://www.stmarksnewbritain.org. Please either print or have the bulletin open on a separate browser tab to participate fully in the service. (For more information on the Zoom service, please go to the back page of the bulletin.)

If there is a significant negative change in the trajectory of the Covid-19 pandemic, we will switch to Zoom-only worship. An email will be sent out to the parish to alert everyone if the service is to be Zoom only.

In-person services at 90 Main Street continue to require that everyone wear a mask and maintain a safe distance inside the buildings of South Church. Masks will be available for those who need them. Thank you.

You can enter the Zoom service via the parish Web link at http://www.stmarksnewbritain.org.

There is also a telephone number that can be used to join the Zoom service:

(phone charges may apply for the telephone call if you do not have unlimited calling).

If you are using a telephone to dial into the service: dial the zoom phone number, and then wait to be prompted by the voice to enter the meeting number. Then, enter the meeting number, and as part of the meeting number, please add the "pound" sign (#) at the end of the meeting number (as the verbal instructions direct).

The Zoom broadcast opens at 9:45 am when remote participants can be admitted and will be greeted by the e-verger.

Remote participants are encouraged to stay connected after the service and greet and be greeted during the coffee hour.

Poor People's Campaign; 1968 and Today

On March 15, 1968, the year before his death, Martin Luther King, Jr. announced the Poor People's

Campaign, "The Southern Christian Leadership Conference will lead waves of the nation's poor and

disinherited to Washington, D.C., next spring to demand redress of their grievances by the United States government and to secure at least jobs or income for all...This is a highly significant event, the beginning of a new co-operation, understanding, and a determination by poor people of all colors and backgrounds to assert and win their right to a decent life and respect for their culture and dignity"

The movement did not die with King. On June 19, 1968, led by King's successor Ralph Abernathy, an estimated 50,000 people joined the Poor People's Campaign in Washington, D.C.

The fight to pass anti-poverty legislation continues today. On June 18, the Poor People's Campaign will again march in D.C. Watch for more information coming soon about how you can be part of the movement and join the Connecticut contingent in D.C.
