Dear Faithful of St. Mark's,

Survey says! We are all familiar, I trust, with the TV game show *Family Feud*. Put it out of your mind. The purpose of our merger survey was NOT to embarrass or even to test anyone. It was an attempt to find out what parishioners are thinking, especially those from whom we may not have heard. My intention in promoting it was not that we would make any decisions simply based on it, but that we might forward our process, and, I think, some things are clearer.

Seventeen people responded to the survey, which is more people than we have in church on a Sunday morning. Of the 17, no one said we should not merge. Eleven said "yes" to a merger, 6 were undecided.

Regarding parishes, there was a clear preference for St. Gabriel's in East Berlin, and St. James in Farmington with each garnering 6 votes. Grace Newington received 3 votes as a second choice. It seems to me that we can narrow our merger discussion to St. Gabriel's and St. James Farmington. If others agree, that might facilitate our discussions at the Annual Meeting.

What struck me in the survey comments and in the split vote between the two parishes is that it seems different people are looking for different things in a merger. I see the differences as being geographic, demographic, and atmospheric. Some prioritize proximity, others seem more focused on the viability of the other parish, and then some consider where they will feel most comfortable. The last consideration relates to both the people in the pews, but also the conduct of the liturgy and the music program.

There is a lot to consider. I look forward to a robust discussion at the Annual Meeting that will NOT resemble the *Family Feud*. You will be happy to know that very soon after the Annual Meeting your Vestry will be meeting with Bishop Laura and Canon Tim Hodapp to discuss our next steps. Merger is on the top of the list, but we will also explore if other possibilities might make sense for St. Mark's.
