Your vestry met with Bishop Laura, Renee (our merger consultant) and St. James' vestry and rector, Father George on May 2nd. While St. Mark's members voiced feelings of grief, loss, and worry, St. James members voiced feelings of empathy and welcome. By the end of the meeting, I was filled with hope and gratitude. St. Mark's can live on, just in a new form. The Holy Spirit is moving among us!

At our May 9th vestry meeting we passed our resolution to formally request permission to merge with St. James, Farmington. I composed a letter with the same resolution which was sent to Bishop Mello and Bishop Laura. We have already received joyful responses from them with "prayers ascending". The bishops will present our request to the diocesan Standing Committee. Permission is assured. And then the next part of our journey begins. Hold onto your hats!

We will have a joint meeting once again to form working groups to handle the merging of our parishes in 4 main areas---

We have a strong core of leaders wanting to keep our mission and faith alive. What we lack is "people power". Joining St. James will allow us to merge into new life.
