Norm & I, with our young son, Kevin, joined St. Mark's in December 1970, and found a church deeply involved in the Community. 147 West Main Street's doors have been open through the years to numerous 12-Step groups, Visiting Nurse Wellness Clinics, youth-theater groups, New Britain Symphony concerts, NEWBRACC meetings and programs and numerous others. Even after leaving our beloved church building, St. Mark's people have continued this tradition of service to and sponsorship of local social service initiatives. This tradition of service to the needs of local groups has continued in recent years with the St. Mark's Food Pantry and Thursday morning "Mingles" where we served up not only breakfast, but friendship as well. At present, "Mingle" is on hiatus, seeking new and energetic volunteers.

Thanks to our Smith Fund, we've been able to give financial support to programs benefitting the homeless and disadvantaged populations of New Britain; among these are New Life II, Coram Deo and, most recently, the Friendship Service Center's newly-opened Hope Connection Center on Arch St. It is our plan to continue services and support to the Community of New Britain even after our joining with St. James' Church in Farmington.

For more than 10 years, when July rolls around, the folks of St. Mark's have put on our St. Mark's T-shirts and dusted off our ice-cream sundae skills. The occasion is the Walk and Roll for Disabilities, sponsored by the local Commission on Persons with Disabilities which seeks to ensure that all residents and visitors with disabilities have equal access to services and activities in accordance with Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act. The 2023 event is scheduled for Wednesday, July 26 in conjunction with the regular Wednesday evening concert at the Band Shell in Walnut Hill Park. The Walk around the Park kicks off at 5:00 p.m., followed by music and dancing and free ice cream sundaes prepared by the expert scoopers, spritzers and sprinklers of St. Mark's. In addition to offering free ice cream sundaes to all in attendance at the Park, church members will also receive requests for prayers to be offered at our regular Sunday services.

Summer Sunday Services

For a variety of reasons associated with our plans to merge with St. James in Farmington,

it will not always be possible to offer Sunday Services in the Erwin Chapel. On these

Sundays, parishioners are encouraged to attend the Sunday Eucharist at St. James in Farmington to promote our getting to know one another and becoming more comfortable worshiping there. Through Labor Day, St. James' one service is at 9:30 a.m. This is livestreamed via FACEBOOK LIVE. Livestream connection is by clicking the "F" icon at the top of the St. James Webpage. After Labor Day there are two services.

Rite 1 is celebrated at 8:00 am, Rite 2 (normally with choir) is celebrated at 10:15 am. Only the 10:15 am service is livestreamed.

A parking tip: When approaching the church turn right just in front of the entrance. Parking to the left (behind the church) is difficult and limited. Across the street from the front door of the church there is ample parking available on Sunday mornings.

Parking at 90 Main St.

Beginning THIS Sunday, June 19th South Church will begin their Summer Service times.

Their Sunday Service will begin at 9:25 a.m. in the Main Sanctuary. This will make parking very difficult. There will be a few spots reserved for St. Mark's.

They will be near the entrance at the "bottom" of the parking lot.

However, if you are able, please park either on the street or in the parking garage next to the police station.

Summer is here! Hopefully, that will mean a mix of fun, rest and renewal for all. It also means that "church" will continue at a more leisurely pace. Things to expect:

- 1. Both St. Mark's and St. James' vestries have formally requested permission to pursue a merger from Bishop Laura and Bishop Jeff. Those requests have been filed with the ECCT Standing Committee in June (permission assured.) The next step is a day-long meeting of the 2 vestries with the bishops to organize committee work which will be scheduled in September.
- 2. Supply priests and our faithful worship leaders take vacations too. For most of the summer, we will not have a priest. We will have a worship leader (thank you Stephen!) intermittently as he is able. Our best alternative is to worship with St. James either in-person or by connecting to their livestream on their website. We are working to offer Zoom listening calls through the phone of an attending parishioner. Stay tuned for our worship schedule and information about St. James alternatives.
- 3. Summer does not stop our ministries! Mark your calendars!
 - a. Food Pantry continues.
 - b. St. Mark's will have its infamous Ice Cream Sundae/Prayer Request booth at New Britain's Ability Walk & Roll July 26th 5-7 p.m. in Walnut Hill Park at the band shell. (Rain Date is Aug 2nd) We hope to have St. James volunteers. If you want to help, please contact me.
 - c. Stephen Hard is joining St. James volunteers on their June/July trip to the Dominican Republic to build a bathroom. Let's keep them in our prayers for safe travel and a successful mission.
 - d. Our Community Ministries Committee has distributed small grants from the Smith Fund to Pastor Dana with New Life II Ministries and to Dave Tompkins to fund his work with the Black Ministers Alliance. Vestry also approved a Smith Fund grant of \$5K to South Church to support their Tuesday Morning Mingle breakfast and Lunch packages to go for the Friendship Center.
