Sunday Services at St. James, Farmington

For a variety of reasons associated with our plans to merge with St. James in Farmington, it will not always be possible to offer Sunday Services in the Erwin Chapel. On these Sundays, parishioners are encouraged to attend the Sunday Eucharist at St. James in Farmington to promote our getting to know one another and becoming more comfortable worshiping there. Through Labor Day, St. James' one service is at 9:30 a.m. This is livestreamed via FACEBOOK LIVE. Livestream connection is by clicking the "F" icon at the top of the St. James Webpage. After Labor Day there are two services.

Rite 1 is celebrated at 8:00 am, Rite 2 (normally with choir) is celebrated at 10:15 am. Only the 10:15 am service is livestreamed.

A parking tip: When approaching the church turn right just in front of the entrance. Parking to the left (behind the church) is difficult and limited. Across the street from the front door of the church there is ample parking available on Sunday mornings.

Hello Everyone! You give me a month off and I forget my clerk duties! Thank goodness we have Cheryl to keep us all informed and functioning well. So here goes. What does our future hold?

- 1. Bishop Laura has scheduled our initial merger meeting for Sept. 7th with Father George, Stephen Hard and our consultant, Renee. We hope this will give us guidelines.
- 2. Over the summer, we have had several worship services at St. James. Speaking for myself, I have felt embraced with sincere welcome by everyone. We have shared activities such as a spaghetti dinner fundraiser at St. James for the Dominican Republic mission trip, and several St. James parishioners helped at St. Mark's ice cream/prayer booth at the New Britain Abilities Walk & Roll. We are off to a great start.
- 3. St James is having their 150th Celebration Craft Fair and Music Fest on Sept 30th, and Bishop Mello will celebrate the Eucharist on Oct. 1st. Let's join in the fun!
- 4. St. Mark's will be its own entity through most of 2024 so we will have our annual Stewardship Campaign. Please look out for a letter in the mail seeking pledges. We are forever thankful.
- 5. Our Community Ministries Committee has been faithfully administering our Smith Fund. Your vestry voted in favor of a \$10K grant to Coram Deo Recovery for mattress replacement in their housing. They support women recovering from domestic abuse and addiction. A \$7500 grant was approved for New Life II Recovery Community Center which supports men re-entering society after addiction struggles, prison sentences, etc. A \$10K grant was given to United Action CT to help immigrants settling in New Britain. We have given Smith Fund support to all of these organizations in the past.

I pray that we may continue to support our neighbors as we also hold our own parishioners close to our hearts as they cope with hardships and celebrate joys.
