I write to the holy remnant of the once numerous parishioners of St. Mark's Episcopal Church New Britain about the next steps in our merger process with St. James Church in Farmington. If I seem excited about this prospect it is because I am. I know that so many of you are grieving the loss of what once was, and some would like to hang on to what remains for as long as possible. I see things differently. We are on a downward trajectory that we worked to correct over the course of many years. My thinking is that I would like us to make substantive changes to our situation while we still have the wherewithal to do so, while we are able to direct rather than just accept what is coming. And that, my friends, is what the meeting on October 21 is all about.

If you would like to be a part of our future, please come to the meeting. As most of you know, I was a Catholic, and a priest. The Episcopal Church handles things very differently from the Catholic Church. We are not told what to do. We are part of the process of discerning God's plan for the future. I like this approach very much, even if it is a great deal messier than the Catholic "from the top" way of doing things. But it only works if you participate in the process. Please come to the meeting. I promise no one will be strong-armed to join a committee, but everyone will have that opportunity to make their voice heard.

Folks often ask me what this is going to look like when it's over. I don't know! I have some ideas, but this will be an effort of both parishes determining God's will for us. To "prime the pump" I will let you know that the process identifies four main areas of exploration: Mission, Finances, Property, and the Canons/Bylaws. Even if none of this interests you, come anyway. Get to know some of the people of St. James and, well, there will be lunch at the end. Please let Cheryl know if you will be joining us for either the meeting and/or the lunch.

Sunday Services at St. James, Farmington

For a variety of reasons associated with our plans to merge with St. James in Farmington, it will not always be possible to offer Sunday Services in the Erwin Chapel. On these Sundays, parishioners are encouraged to attend the Sunday Eucharist at St. James in Farmington to promote our getting to know one another and becoming more comfortable worshiping there. There are two services. Rite 1 is celebrated at 8:00 am, Rite 2 (normally with choir) is celebrated at 10:15 am. This is livestreamed via FACEBOOK LIVE. Livestream connection is by clicking the **"F"** icon at the top of the St. James Webpage. Only the 10:15 am service is livestreamed.

A parking tip: When approaching the church turn right just in front of the entrance. Parking to the left (behind the church) is difficult and limited. Across the street from the front door of the church there is ample parking available on Sunday mornings.

Merger Parishes Meeting October 21 - 9:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

The people of St. Mark's New Britain and St. James Farmington are Cordially invited to meet on Saturday, October 21 from 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in Hart Hall, South Church, New Britain, to discuss the merger of the parishes.

Bishop Laura Ahrens will lead the meeting and we will be joined by Renee Janes of Grace & St. John's Episcopal Church in Hamden. Renee was involved in the merger of Grace & St. Peter's in Hamden with St John the Evangelist in Yalesville and was asked by Bishop Laura to assist with our process.

Besides an opportunity for us to get to know one another better, understand the process we are undertaking, and answer parishioner questions, we will set up committees to do the work going forward. Everyone will not want to be part of a committee, but for those who will want to be more involved in the process, that opportunity will be available.
