## THE LION'S PAUSE STEPHEN HARD, SENIOR WARDEN

Dear St. Mark's Faithful.

A few things stood out for me at our "merger meeting" with St. James, Farmington. The first is that Bishop Laura made very clear that we will chart our own course. The ECCT will support our efforts but won't be micromanaging the process. When we left the meeting, we had not been given any marching orders. Father George and I determined that the next step was a meeting of the Vestries to determine the composition of the four committees suggested by the ECCT. Those committees are Canonical (Bylaws), Finance, Mission, and Property. We are hoping to have this meeting within the next few weeks when a member of each Vestry will be assigned to co-chair each committee. The parameters of each committee will also be determined. Each committee has a staff person at the ECCT who will assist with the process as needed.

Another thing that stood out for me was how some of the tough questions were openly raised, what we are going to call the new parish being one of the toughest. But E.J. Ososki, St. James Treasurer, asked the further question of how St. Mark's folks might feel when some of our endowment funds might be used for improvements to the St. James' complex. But the contribution that stood out the most for me was offered by our own Molly Sherman. She raised the issue that this merger might seem like an unequal union since our numbers are so small. Molly paid tribute to the significant financial assets we bring to the merger, but she even more poignantly said something like: "We may not have numbers, but we have fervor."

As I consider our holy remnant, I am struck by the selfless dedication, the "fervor," of all who remain. When we bring that to the new parish, we will be giving a gift far greater than money. In my decades of work with nonprofits I was always struck by those who moaned: "If only we had more money!" I never bought that. All the money in the world is useless and may even do great harm without people having both the

#### **Sunday Services at St. James, Farmington**

There are two services. Rite 1 is celebrated at 8:00 am, Rite 2 (normally with choir) is celebrated at 10:15 am. This is livestreamed via FACEBOOK LIVE. Livestream connection is by clicking the "F" icon at the top of the St. James Webpage. Only the 10:15 am service is livestreamed.

A parking tip: When approaching the church turn right just in front of the entrance. Parking to the left (behind the church) is difficult and limited. Across the street from the front door of the church there is ample parking available on Sunday mornings.

**November 5:** Almighty and merciful God, it is only by your gift that your faithful people offer you true and laudable service: Grant that we may run without stumbling to obtain your heavenly promises; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

#### November 11 - Veterans Day: For those in the Armed Forces of our Country

Almighty God, we commend to your gracious care and keeping all the men and women of our armed forces at home and abroad. Defend them day by day with your heavenly grace; strengthen them in their trials and temptations; give them courage to face the perils which beset them; and grant them a sense of your abiding presence wherever they may be; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.* BCP pg. 823
