

Contemporary Collects and Prayers

December 3 - 1 Advent - Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness, and put on the armor of light, now in the time of this mortal life in which your Son Jesus Christ came to visit us in great humility; that in the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge both the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

December 6 - Feast of St. Nicholas of Myra - Almighty God, who in your love gave to your servant Nicholas of Myra a perpetual name for deeds of kindness on land and sea: Grant, we pray, that your Church may never cease to work for the happiness of children, the safety of sailors, the relief of the poor, and the help of those tossed by tempests of doubt or grief; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

December 10 - 2 Advent - Merciful God, who sent your messengers the prophets to preach repentance and prepare the way for our salvation: Give us grace to heed their warnings and forsake our sins, that we may greet with joy the coming of Jesus Christ our Redeemer; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

December 17 - 3 Advent - Stir up your power, O Lord, and with great might come among us; and, because we are sorely hindered by our sins, let your bountiful grace and mercy speedily help and deliver us; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, be honor and glory, now and for ever. *Amen.*

December 24 - 4 Advent - Purify our conscience, Almighty God, by your daily visitation, that your Son Jesus Christ, at his coming, may find in us a mansion prepared for himself; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

December 25 - Christmas Day - O God, you make us glad by the yearly festival of the birth of your only Son Jesus Christ: Grant that we, who joyfully receive him as our Redeemer, may with sure confidence behold him when he comes to be our Judge; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

December 31 - 1 Christmas - Almighty God, you have poured upon us the new light of your incarnate Word: Grant that this light, enkindled in our hearts, may shine forth in our lives; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Sunday Services at St. James, Farmington

There are two services. Rite 1 is celebrated at 8:00 am, Rite 2 (normally with choir) is celebrated at 10:15 am. This is livestreamed via FACEBOOK LIVE. Livestream connection is by clicking the **"F"** icon at the top of the St. James Webpage. Only the 10:15 am service is livestreamed.

Happy Thanksgiving, a few days past, and Happy almost Advent! This time of year always catches me off-guard. While it is filled with joys and gratefulness, it seems too overloaded to experience fully. St. Mark's is launching full speed ahead too. Our focus in 2024 will be our transition to a completed merger with St. James, Farmington.

Our vestries have met a couple of times and formed 4 main committees (Canonical, Finance, Property and Mission). These committees will define the tangible and intangible customs of both parishes in order to make one cohesive parish. Good news! These committees are open to **everyone**. Please ask a vestry member for more information so you can make the parish yours. No idea is too small. Another teaser: What will our name be? Give it some thought. Both parishes will be doing a survey soon.

St. Mark's will continue to be its own entity until the final blessing at next October's CT Diocesan Convention. Our home base will be Erwin Chapel and South Church. We are still dependent on the availability of supply priests for worship services. Therefore, here is a brief outline of service plans for December 2023 to October 2024:

December Sundays: Rev. Joan Phelps and Rev. Joe Pace, Erwin Chapel

Christmas Eve: 10 a.m. and 8 p.m. Rev. Joe Pace (time may change), Erwin Chapel

Holy Week and Easter 2024: St. James, Farmington

Pentecost: Special Final Erwin Chapel service with Rev. Pat Hames We will give updates as the weeks go by and provide instructions for attending St. James' services virtually.

Father George Roberts at St. James Church is available for any pastoral needs.

St. Mark's continues to administer the Smith Fund to benefit the needy in its parish. The fund recently contributed \$5K to Warm the Children clothing drive. The vestry approved a grant of \$50K to the new Hope Connection Center managed by the Friendship Service Center (FSC). The vestry listened to an impressive presentation by 2 FSC directors showing that they have been able to find housing for 100 households since the opening in February 2023, often without using homeless shelters.

Last but not least, the vestry accepted with regret the resignation of Curtis Searle. We are thankful for his faithful service and hope we continue to see him in an unofficial capacity. At the same time, we welcome Dave Tompkins to serve the rest of Curtis' term until 2024.

Wreaths and Symbols by Evelyn Briere 2007

One of the things I love about our church and faith is the rhythm and beauty of its teachings.

As we begin our church year, Advent, this coming Sunday, there are many symbols that identify and tell us of the season.

The Advent Wreath has many symbols. Really look at it – what do you see?

It is green – life and growth

it has four candles – we light one for each Sunday in Advent. The Light of the World is coming to overcome the darkness. Candles stand for Hope, Peace, Love and Joy.

It has the color purple – candles and/or ribbon – Penitence Prayer, Preparation. (The color purple also designates

Royalty and Sovereignty.)

One candle is rose colored – this is to remind us of the joy that is coming.

It is round, a circle with no beginning and no end. This is connected with the symbol of Advent in the Greek letter A – for Alpha and O – for Omega intertwined, "I am the beginning and the end, saith the Lord."

It tell us God is eternal in his love and care for us. Beautiful!

On Christmas Eve the ribbons are changed to red, the color of joy and celebration. Our Lord and Savior has come, a babe in the manger – Amazing!

A simple prayer to use during Advent is:

Come into my heart Lord Jesus. There is room in my heart for you! Amen.
