Dear St. Mark's Faithful,

As we enter another year of Our Lord, we have so much for which to be grateful and even greater blessings to anticipate. I am reminded of words of Maria from *The Sound of Music*: "When the Lord closes a door somewhere he opens a window." The "window" for us is St. James Church in Farmington.

On January 18 there is a joint Vestry meeting with St. James. At this meeting our committees will be reporting their progress on the work of our merger. Our Mission Committee is reviewing the work of our parishes and will be making recommendations for integrating this work into the new parish. Our Bylaws/Canons Committee is developing the important legal documents that will structure our life together. The Finance Committee has embarked on deciphering the ways of money in each of our parishes and determining the practices and procedures we will adopt for the new parish. Finally, the work of the Property Committee is well advanced since St. Mark's did so much work in this regard as we sold our historic property and moved to South.

This is both an exciting time and a profound opportunity. We do not need to just do things as we always have, but as we merge, we can examine past practices and make improvements. This is a great deal of work. I hope as many of you as possible will join in the effort! All committee meetings are open to all members of both parishes and we will be diving into the thorny issue of what to name our new parish soon. Please mark your calendars for Sunday, February 4. This will be our final Annual Meeting as St. Mark's. We will meet in Cooper Hall following our regular 10:00 a.m. Eucharist. Vestry has set the date for our final regular service in the Erwin Chapel for Pentecost Sunday, May 31, 2024. After that day we will be worshiping with St. James. 

Sunday Services at St. James, Farmington

There are two services. Rite 1 is celebrated at 8:00 am, Rite 2 (normally with choir) is celebrated at 10:15 am. This is livestreamed via FACEBOOK LIVE. Livestream connection is by clicking the **"F"** icon at the top of the St. James Webpage. Only the 10:15 am service is livestreamed.

Contemporary Collects and Prayers

January 1 - Holy Name - Eternal Father, you gave to your incarnate Son the holy name of Jesus to be the sign of our salvation: Plant in every heart, we pray, the love of him who is the Savior of the world, our Lord Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, in glory everlasting. *Amen*. January 7 - Father in heaven, who at the baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan proclaimed him your beloved Son and anointed him with the Holy Spirit: Grant that all who are baptized into his Name may keep the covenant they have made, and boldly confess him as Lord and Savior; who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, in glory everlasting. *Amen*.

January 14 - Almighty God, whose Son our Savior Jesus Christ is the light of the world: Grant that your people, illumined by your Word and Sacraments, may shine with the radiance of Christ's glory, that he may be known, worshipped, and obeyed to the ends of the earth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

January 15 - Martin Luther King, Jr. Day - Grant, O God, that your holy and life-giving Spirit may so move every human heart [and especially the hearts of the people of this land], that barriers which divide us may crumble, suspicions disappear, and hatreds cease; that our divisions being healed, we may live in justice and peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

January 21- Give us grace, O Lord, to answer readily the call of our Savior Jesus Christ and proclaim to all people the Good News of his salvation, that we and the whole world may perceive the glory of his marvelous works; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

January 28- Almighty and everlasting God, you govern all things both in heaven and on earth: Mercifully hear the supplications of your people, and in our time grant us your peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.
